As a kid, Stacy didn't think that she was good at science. When she went to college at New York City's Fashion Institute of Technology, though, she discovered this wasn't true. By doing hands-on experiments, Stacy realized that she learned just a little differently than her friends and that she really WAS good at science and chemistry!

After college, Stacy worked with fabric and textiles at companies like DuPont (they make chemicals), Target (they make clothing), and Eddie Bauer (they make clothing too). While working at these companies, she saw firsthand how much water and energy it took to make every piece of clothing and how much waste is generated when we throw away old clothes.



With that in mind, she began to work on projects around cloth recycling and, in 2014, she and her colleague, Christopher Stanev, founded Evrnu—a company dedicated to recycling cloth waste into pristine new thread that can be turned into new fabric and clothing. Doing this significantly reduces the water and energy needed to create new clothes and cloth materials.
